SCHOOL OVERVIEW

Alonsa School is a community-based Kindergarten to Grade 12 school with an enrolment of 105 students. Our school has a teaching Principal, a teaching Resource teacher, 9 Teachers, and 6 Educational Assistants. We also have a secretary, a librarian, a custodian, a cleaner, a community connector, a community connector support worker and 5 bus drivers. Alonsa School offers programs in Human Ecology, Woods, Automotive, Electrical, Resource and a wide range of Academic Studies. We offer full time kindergarten, a nursery program that runs on Tuesdays and Thursdays, a school social worker clinician, speech language services and student services. Our school Social Worker Clinician is shared by the division and is in our school every Thursday to work with students, our Speech and Language Pathologist visits our school a few days a month, while Education Assistants work with students the remainder of the time. Alonsa School has a Smart board in every classroom, a portable iPad cart, two portable Laptop carts, a designated computer lab and 2 new touch TVs. Alonsa School, with the support of Turtle River School Division, prides itself on its ability to keep up with technological advances. Grade 9 students receive a new laptop for their use and are able to keep it if they graduate from Turtle River School Division.

SCHOOL PRIORITIES

1. LITERACY

By June 2023, 75% of students in grades 2 to 8 will be either reading at grade level or have gained at least one full grade level of reading achievement (based on the divisional reading assessment)

2. NUMERACY

By June 2023, 70% of students in grades 4-9 will demonstrate an understanding of 70% or more of the "Essential Outcomes" in math.

3. MENTAL HEALTH

By June 2023, 75% of grade 7-12 students will report low levels of anxiety and 65% of students grades 7-12 will report low levels of depression.

COMMUNITY CONNECTOR MRS. GURKE

This school year has seen the return of many of our favorite programs. Daily breakfast is served along with a once per week free hot lunch, empathy programs, numerous presentations and the ever popular volleyball nights!

Our grades 7-12 students participated in the Robb Nash Project Curriculum during their health classes. The Robb Nash Project- A Living Curriculum is a student-focused mental wellness curriculum that uses real-life stories and music to support social and emotional learning. After completion of the curriculum, the students attended a free Robb Nash concert in Winnipeg.

We also saw the introduction of the Harmony Program in one of our classrooms. Harmony is a social and emotional learning program for Pre-K-6 grade students. Harmony fosters knowledge, skills, and attitudes youth need to develop healthy identities, create meaningful relationships, and engage productively by providing SEL learning resources, tools, and strategies. It is our hope to introduce the program in multiple classrooms during 2023-2024 school year.

We are celebrating the end of the school year with our annual barbeque alongside our second annual Manitoba House Métis Heritage Day! Students will be showcasing the skills they have developed through their fiddle lessons with Mr. Campbell through their fiddle lessons over the school year. SPORTS NEWS

This year sports were back, and students enjoyed the competitions. In September, soccer started the year. At the senior level we did not have a team. The junior mixed team placed 3rd at the divisional level. Next was volleyball. We were unable to have a senior level girls team but the boys were able to combine with McCreary School to form a team. The team finished 1st at the divisional and zone levels. They participated in Provincials and placed 4th. At the junior level, the boys finished 5th at divisionals and the girls finished in 1st place.

Next was basketball, with no senior level teams. At the junior level, the girls finished 3^{rd} and the boys finished in 5^{th} place in divisionals.

During curling the senior boys finished in 2nd place at divisionals but did not go on to compete at the zone level. The mixed doubles team placed 1st at zones and 4th in their pool at provincials. At the junior level, the girls placed 2nd, the boys placed 4th and the mixed team placed 1st at the divisional level.

For badminton at the senior level Hayley and Ethan placed 3rd in zones. At the junior varsity level Hunter placed 3rd at zones. At the Junior level, CJ placed 2nd in boys singles, Summer and Aloyse placed 3rd in girls doubles, Jade and Colter placed 1st in mixed doubles and Rocky and James placed first in boys doubles.

Finally there was track and field. We had 3 boys, Colt, Liam, and Ethan compete in the junior varsity pentathlon at the provincial level, Sam Gurke competed in the senior varsity pentathlon, Hayley competed in the senior varsity girls pentathlon and in the high jump.
