## Message from the Superintendent



It has been an amazing year. **Turtle River School Division has been celebrating 50 years** of providing students, families, and the community with a quality education. Our students demonstrate everyday how much we have to offer. We must always thank the great people that make up our division; yourselves. It is the strong communities and the people in them that make our division so successful. There are so many wonderful things to report on it makes it difficult to reduce to just a few. As a result, I will select a few of the highlights to discuss.

We have had a lot of excitement over the past two years by participating in a Numeracy Research Project with other divisions. It focused on grades 6 & 9 and has helped to support instruction and Overall Student Learning. The emphasis supports intentional decisions that we can make to support student learning. Moving forward with the addition of grades 7 & 8 over the next two years we are excited as we continue improving numeracy.

The implementation of a New ELA Curriculum for Grades 1-8 is also supporting more discourse in student learning with more engagement in critical thinking and effective discussions. Students have more ownership of their learning as they progress and learn. The curriculum is moving away from outcomes and into learning descriptors. Grades are being replaced by grade bands. Students should be diving deep into critical thinking and analysis. The division will be participating in a New ELA Cohort with surrounding divisions. This will continue to support instruction as teachers can share techniques, strategies, practice, and ideas.

We are continuing to build capacity in schools in all areas. We support ALL Students. The use of Classroom Profiles and School Profiles help guide us to make data and evidence-based decisions. The Division has also developed a Leadership Improvement Plan that supports School Principals as they continue to grow themselves as well as their schools. The Division began working with PLC's to support staff growth last year. PLC's are Professional Learning Communities. This is where teachers work on self-directed areas of improvement with other educators as they work to learn and grow in that selected area. This will be the second year as we continue working in PLC's.

We are continuing with offering a French Junior Kindergarten in École Laurier and an English Junior Kindergarten program in Glenella Schools. Next year we look to offer 10 full days of Kindergarten Here I Come (KHIC) for 2018/2019. We have Full-Time Kindergarten in all of our schools. The past few years we have partnered up with and been running 3 &4-year-old screening clinics. This upcoming year we are embracing a new assessment tool called "EYE". EYE stands for Early Years Evaluation and it will help educators assess student abilities and provide immediate feedback. We want to help support students and families as early as possible to support their learning as they enter school.

As education and society continue to evolve, so must we change what and how we do things in order to prepare students for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. This will sometimes look much different from the time you may have been in school, but to students it is all they know. The top ten jobs for students in school have not yet been invented. This is why we must continue to evolve education and educate students with a focus of being flexible and highly adaptable. Students must be critical thinkers and problem solvers if they will be successful.

We are beginning to see growth overall in all of our efforts. Our Provincial Assessment Results have identified/verified that we are doing better. If you have a chance, please look closer at the data that I will share later at the end of this report. We are making strong gains in all areas, reading, writing, and math. It is so amazing to finally see the results of all of the hard work by the students and staff. Our Division looks bright with strong educational programming and dedicated staff members that will work hard in ensuring that all students are successful!

I would like to congratulate all of our graduates this year. Be sure to take the time and enjoy this moment. You did it, all of your hard work has paid off!

Your life's adventure is entering the next phase and it will be great!

## 2018/2019 Turtle River School Division Goals

- 1. Literacy By January 2019, 40% of ALL mid-grade 8 students will meet expectations in all three sub-competencies in expository writing (Jan 2017 at 25%).
- **2.** Numeracy By January 2019, 40% of ALL grade 7 students will meet mid-grade performance in all five sub-competencies in number sense and number skills (Jan 2017 at 28.1%).
- **3.** School Climate By June 2019, Students in Grades 7-12 will have a 2% improvement in the 6 identified positive school climate indicators. (participation in sports or clubs, school sense of belonging, reduction of moderate to severe bullying, feelings of safety when attending school, positive teacher-student relationships, and feelings of a positive learning climate).
- **4. Student Engagement** By June 2019, Students in Grades 7-12 will report a 2% improvement in the following 5 identified academic engagement indicators (academic engagement, valuing school outcomes, having positive relationships, aspirations on finishing high school, and students reporting high levels of interest and motivation).
- **5. Mental Wellness** By June 2019, 85% of Grade 7-12 students will report low levels of anxiety and depression.





## **Turtle River Students Making Huge Gains**



## Early Years Provincial Assessment Results







## Middle Years Provincial Assessment Results
