Grading Policy

4 point scale rubric

4: Mastery – the student has an in-depth understanding of the concept and consistently demonstrates an ability to perform the task, or goes above and beyond what is expected at grade-level

3: Grade Level – the student can demonstrate an understanding of the concept and can perform the task within grade-level expectations

2: Approaching Grade Level – the student sometimes demonstrates an understanding of the concept, usually with prompting and can sometimes perform the task, or is able to perform the task but below grade-level expectations

1: Below Grade Level – the student is unable to demonstrate an adequate understanding of the concept without prompting

ND: Not Demonstrated – the student is unable to demonstrate an understanding of the concept
