# **Ecole Laurier**

# **Community Report 2024-2025**

Ecole Laurier is a Junior Kindergarten to Grade 8 French Immersion school, currently serving 31 students with a dedicated team of 4.4 professional staff and 3 support staff mem-

The French Immersion program at École Laurier is designed for students whose first language is not French. Its goal is to develop students who can communicate spontaneously, independently, and confidently in French, taking pride in their ability to do so. Students are encouraged to seek meaningful opportunities to engage with the Francophone community. Through this program, students develop a bilingual identity as Canadian citizens proficient in both French and English, opening doors to lifelong opportunities and fostering an appreciation for other languages and cultures.

French is the language of instruction for all subject areas except English Language Arts and Music/Band, which are taught in English. Students in the French Immersion program follow the same curriculum outcomes as those in the English program, with the addition of French Language Arts.

## School Goals

During the 2024/2025 school year, École Laurier set very high goals that focused on improving their priorities

- 1. By June 2025, 88% of grade 2-8 students will be either reading at grade level or have gained at least one full grade level of reading achievement in English (based on F& P reading assessment). Not Met: 85% of students in grade 2-8 either have gained a full grade level of reading or are at grade level in English reading. 79% of girls met this goal and 100% of boys met this goal. Girls make up 70% of the total number of students.
- 2. By June 2025, 82% of students in grade 4-8 will demonstrate an understanding of 70% or more of the grade level essential outcomes in math. (as assessed by the mRLC formative guiz #4 administered by classroom teachers). Not Met: 77% of students in grade 4-8 demonstrated understanding of 70% or more of the essential outcomes in math, 67% of girls met this goal and 100% of boys met this goal. Girls make up 69% of the
- 3. By June 2025, every student in grades K to 8 will have the opportunity to take part in lessons involving a minimum of eight Social Emotional Learning topics. Met: We have completed more than 8 SEL lessons per homeroom class. Teachers used to deliver the lessons. The staff focused on one specific SEL topic per month.
- 4. By June 2025, students will participate in semimonthly French clubs led by staff, designed to increase engagement, exposure and usage of French language.
- 5. During the 2024-2025 school year, École Laurier students will maintain the 14 ESD projects from the past years that incorporate the fundamental principles of sustainable development. Met: Students have maintained at least 14 ESD projects this

## French Jr. Kindergarten Program

This is the ninth year of our French Jr. Kindergarten program for the division. We had 3 Jr. K graduates this year. The program introduces the students to the school environment. It orientates them to classroom routines and expected behavior, while helping to improve social skills and relieving possible anxieties about starting school. Through play, the students are introduced to academic fundamentals such as letters, shapes and numbers. They are exposed to the French language and culture, quickly being able to understand French and eventually repeating songs and basic commands. This program is offered free of charge to four year old children and it complements our full-time Kindergarten program. We want to offer families with options and this program will be offered again next school year. We are pleased that Mme Jeannine Delaurier will be returning to teach this program in the fall.

## Universally Accessible School Nutrition Program

This government initiative's main goal is to ensure that no child goes through the school day hungry, helping them focus better and perform well in their academic year. We were able to provide hot lunches and additional snacks for students throughout the year. We also purchased a dishwasher for this program. We will be receiving financial support through this program again next year.

## Odyssey Program

The OLP (Explore, Destination Clic, and Odyssey) are funded by the Government of Canada and administered by ministries and departments of education across the country. Officials from each province and territory work with the Council of Ministers of Education, Canada (CMEC) to promote the programs, establish common procedures and regulations, and help to ensure success for all participants. The programs have been operating across Canada since 1971.

École Laurier is grateful to Turtle River School Division for supporting the Odyssey program in our school for many years. We have been fortunate to have the extra support of a French Language Assistant.

#### What is a French Language Assistant?

The French Language Assistant plays a key role in the lives of our students. Under the direction of the teacher, they provide students with opportunities to practice their French language skills and learn about other Canadian cultural identities. They develop and deliver activities to help students improve their French language skills in real-life situations. By drawing on their interests and those of the students, they motivate them to learn French while having fun.

## French Second Language Revitalization Program

École Laurier was fortunate this year to receive funding for three French Second Language Revitalization Grants to help support our French Immersion program. The first grant aimed to enhance the linguistic and cultural identity of our students so that they can communicate in French with confidence and fluency in academic, cultural and social contexts. This year, it supported events such as the Festival du Voyageur Activity Day, Meaghan Bramley Memorial Steppers, Circo Balanzo, trip to Musée du Manitoba and la Roue Culturelle avec Ian Porteous.

Our second grant project of purchasing French children's literature relating to social justice and equality as well as social-emotional topics, targeted the initiative of creating a school setting appropriate for learning French by ensuring appropriate materials are in place to support French language learning. It also targeted the initiative of focusing on language acquisition by improving student's French vocabulary.

Qur third grant supported the development of a video series to showcase the French Immersion program at Ecole Laurier. Students and staff played a key role in bringing these videos to life, in collaboration with Grow Media Group. Once finalized, the videos will be shared on our social media platforms.

In the past 8 years, École Laurier has been granted \$59,500 from this program to support projects and initiatives in our school.

## Sustainable Development Highlights

École Laurier students continued to recycle, reuse and reduce. The Club de français students planted the school garden with various types of vegetables. This will allow for a fall harvest when we return in September. We have been watering the garden and flowers using rain water collected in our rain barrel. This year, we purchased a LOMI composter for our school to help reduce food waste in an eco-friendly way. It allows us to turn our organic waste into nutrient-rich soil that can be used in our school garden.

The school uses Sway, an app from Microsoft Office, for our monthly newsletters and letters to parents are sent via email. Thus replacing the need for paper copies.

Teachers, through curriculum, guided students to connect their personal lifestyle to their ecological footprint and understand the impact on others and take action. Teachers also used the program Moozoom to help promote wellness. Students gave back to their community through the Terry Fox Run, Food Bank collection, Christmas Hamper Program and the annual town and Highway clean-up campaigns.

The construction of our new outdoor classroom is now complete! We are excited to begin using this new learning space next school year.
