

McCreary School is a K-12 institution with an enrolment of 155 students. This year, our team included 15.5 professional staff, 6 educational assistants, a school secretary, a librarian, two custodians, and four bus drivers.

Student Council Highlights

Grades 5 to 12 Student Council were able to plan Spirit Days, Two School Dances, a Video Game Night, and some Activity Days. Student Council ran a School Canteen all year providing students with access to snacks. The Canteen doesn't make a great amount of money, but it provides a service to the student body and families, providing access to food and snacks for purchase at just a little over cost. This is a value alone to everyone and is why we run it and volunteer to make school better. The funding raised from the canteen goes to pay for the couches, Air Hockey table, Ping Pong table, and television we purchased for the student lounge. This was the first full year where Grade 7-12 students could fully utilize and enjoy their Student Lounge and it was well used by all students. Hot Chocolate Days were also a big hit during the winter months. The canteen profits also go towards covering the costs for the events we run and provide juice, hot chocolate, and popcorn for all students. There is no cost for students to participate in any of these events. Lots of the money fundraised also went towards sports equipment for use during recess, and in the gym and weight room.





Social Justice Highlights

This year, McCreary School's Social Justice Club, Operation Difference Makers, has been actively working to make a positive impact in our community. Their initiatives included supporting local fundraisers, hosting meetings and events to promote a positive school culture, organizing a school-wide Empowerment Day of Pink, and collecting food donations for community hampers.



Provincial Assessments

Grade 3 Provincial Results -FALL 2024

McCreary School-2025

Numeracy: Students meeting outcomes in each of the areas included:

- patterning—33%
- meaning of equal symbol—33%
- whole numbers -78%
- mental math strategies—44%

Reading: Students meeting outcomes in each of the 3 areas included:

- Reflects and sets goals 67%
- Uses strategies to make meaning of text-67%
- Demonstrates comprehension—67%

Overall, in the Early Years, we need to focus on student understanding on what they are doing in math. Students need to learn new strategies in order to improve Number Sense. Students being more involved in their reading growth is also an important area to work on as they focus on the understanding of what they are reading (comprehension).

In the Middle Years, Grade 8 students continue to do well in reading and writing, but we are seeing a slight decline, reinforcing that we need to continue practicing on The Writing Process and especially the revising their work. In Grade 7, Mathematics seen excellent results with students having a strong foundation and requiring attention in the Number Pattern areas moving forward. We need to focus more on number sense and continue to work on problem solving.
