In grade 12 Essential Math the students have completed the section on Buying and Leasing a Vehicle. They have researched the advantages of buying a new vehicle, buying a used vehicle, and leasing a vehicle. They are halfway through the unit on Precision and Measurement. The grade 12 students are all registered to write their provincial exam in June.

In grade 11 Essential Math students have researched how to invest money. They have completed problems on compound interest and have solved equations involving GST and PST. Currently students are working on understanding how to interpret graphs.

In Tourism students have researched various web sites, including Tourism Manitoba. They have formulated pamphlets on exciting places to visit in Manitoba. Students have studied the various types of tourism, and the reasons people travel. Students have identified barriers to tourism.

In grade 5/6 Physical Education students are developing their Floor Ball skills. They have completed a number of drills to improve their stick handling skills. They perform warmups using their stick and plastic balls. Students have demonstrated the proper way to hold a stick, and perform a wrist shot.

In grades 9 to 12 Physical Education, students have participated in a number of activities. They have competed in simple games like Mission Impossible and Swamp Ball. Students have demonstrated how to hit a shuttle in Badminton. The class has worked out in the weight room on a consistent basis. They have formulated fitness programs. Students are understanding the importance of leading a healthy lifestyle.



# Science + Math

### **Chemistry 40S**

We've spent the last four weeks discussing three examples of aqueous reactions: precipitate reactions, neutralization reactions, and reduction oxidation reactions. Students already performed their first lab of the semester too; an acid base titration. Students used stock solutions of nitric acid and sulfuric acid to determine the concentration of a diluted sodium hydroxide solution.

### **Grade 11 Pre-Cal**

The ladies in pre-cal have hit the ground running and have already completed two of their nine units. Our first unit was all about number patterns with arithmetic and geometric sequences and series; something we have never studied before. Our second unit, however, was trigonometry, something we had already discussed in applied last semester, but with a new twist.

Next up, we revisit quadratic functions and equations.

### **Grade 9 Math**

Grade 9 math is a full year course, so students got a little bit of a break during exam week, but we picked up where we left off and are just about to write our next unit test on linear relations, equations, and inequalities.

We've also been reflecting on our first mRLC quiz results to see what we need to focus our review time on over the next couple weeks as we prepare for the second quiz.

### **Grade 10 Applied Math**

The grade 10s have been busy this month. We started the course with a look at the metric and imperial measurement systems and the strategies that can be used to convert within and between these systems. We then expanded that idea to conversions of units for surface area and volume. Then we wrapped up the second unit with surface area and volume calculations of basic and composite shapes.



Miss Lauryn Dunning will be joining us from March 10<sup>th</sup> to May 2<sup>nd</sup> to complete her final student teaching placement. During this time, she will gradually take over the teaching role in each of my four courses.

### **February Report**

Since the start of our second semester on February 3, high school students have been busy with their new coursework, alongside a variety of extracurricular activities. It has been a dynamic month, with students wrapping up their broomball, hockey, basketball, and curling seasons. With the new semester underway, we've begun ELA 20F with the tenthgrade students, ELA 40S with the twelfth-graders, Canada in the Contemporary World with the ninth-graders, and History 30F with the eleventh and twelfth-grade students.

As mentioned earlier, I've had the chance to teach several courses to our high school students this semester. Below is some information about the topics we've covered so far.

ELA 20F – (The Drafting Process, Personal Narratives, Coat of Arms Visual Arts)
ELA 40S – (Personal inventory, the basics of writing, Personal Collage Visual Arts, elements of writing –ideas, language use, structure, and conventions.)

CCW 10E – (Capadian culture, citizenship

**CCW 10F** – (Canadian culture, citizenship, rights sand laws.)

**History 30F** (First People and French Exploration)
